

## **Medical Student Involvement on Clinical Rotations**

Supervising physicians will be members of the MCH Medical Staff.

Supervised Resident staff will be active Texas Tech University Health Science Center at the Permian Basin Resident physicians in training programs of Family Practice, Internal Medicine, and OBGYN.

Medical student involvement on clinical rotations will be under the preceptorship of the supervising physician and/or the supervised Medical Resident staff.

Students are not licensed physicians and therefore are not permitted to practice medicine, but are in an education program accredited by the Liaison Committee on Medical Education.

Students will be participating in patient care activities; but only under the direction and guidance of their supervising physician, supervised resident staff and as appropriate the staff of MCH.

Medical Students are permitted to document in the patient medical record while supervised. Specifically these portions:

- chief complaint,**
- review of systems,**
- past medical family/social history**

may be referenced by the supervising physician for billing purposes when comment and signature are present.

The documentation of

- history of present illness,**
- physical examination,**
- medical decision making**

are used solely for educational purposes.

Supervising physicians will comply with all MCH policy.
